What Support Can We Give You

The Additional Learning Support department can offer you a range of support depending on your level of need. This may include:



1:1 in class support if appropriate



1:1 / small group out of class support



Eng, Maths & vocational workshops



Social skills workshops and lunch club if appropriate



Access to specialist staff



Specialist equipment and software

Getting Started

If you feel you may benefit from support:

- ✓ Meet a member of the ALS team and inform them of your needs.
- ✓ They will help you complete a **DECLARATION** form. You could also complete this form online.
- ✓ Depending on your needs, they will create a **SUPPORT** plan and inform you of the sessions you could attend.
- ✓ We will ask **for your permission** to share information about you with people who will be supporting you, such as your teachers.
- ✓ We will give your teachers advice and guidance on reasonable adjustments they can make for you and the support they can provide

You must let us know if your conditions change or if you are diagnosed with new conditions during the academic year.



Other Support

Depending on your level of need, you may need:

- ✓ A risk assessment to keep you and your peers safe.
- ✓ You may also have a personal emergency evacuation plan to show you where to go and what to do if you need help evacuating the building in case of an emergency.
- ✓ You may be able to loan out a laptop or reader pen if needed – subject to availability.

You must let us know if your conditions change or if you are diagnosed with new conditions during the academic year.



ANNUAL REVIEWS FOR LEARNERS WITH EHCPs

Our dedicated EHCP Coordinator is responsible for the coordination of annual reviews which will take place once per academic year.

Parents and carers will be supported in understanding the process, and encouraged to contribute and attend the meeting to ensure the best possible outcome for learners.

Work Based Learning

We have dedicated Work based Learning Support Practitioners in the team. If you have a learning difficulty, disability or health condition it is important that you make use of the support available. You must complete a declaration form so that we can create a support plan for you that best suits your needs.

Croydon College can make **reasonable adjustments** for you and can advise your employers how they can best support you.

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Higher Education


We have a dedicated HE Learning Support Practitioner in the team.
